People were guessing all kinds of things about Jesus. Some of them thought Jesus must be John the Baptist. John had preached about the Savior who would come and had been killed by King Herod. They thought maybe God had raised John from the dead! Others assumed that Jesus must be an Old Testament prophet who had been raised from the dead.

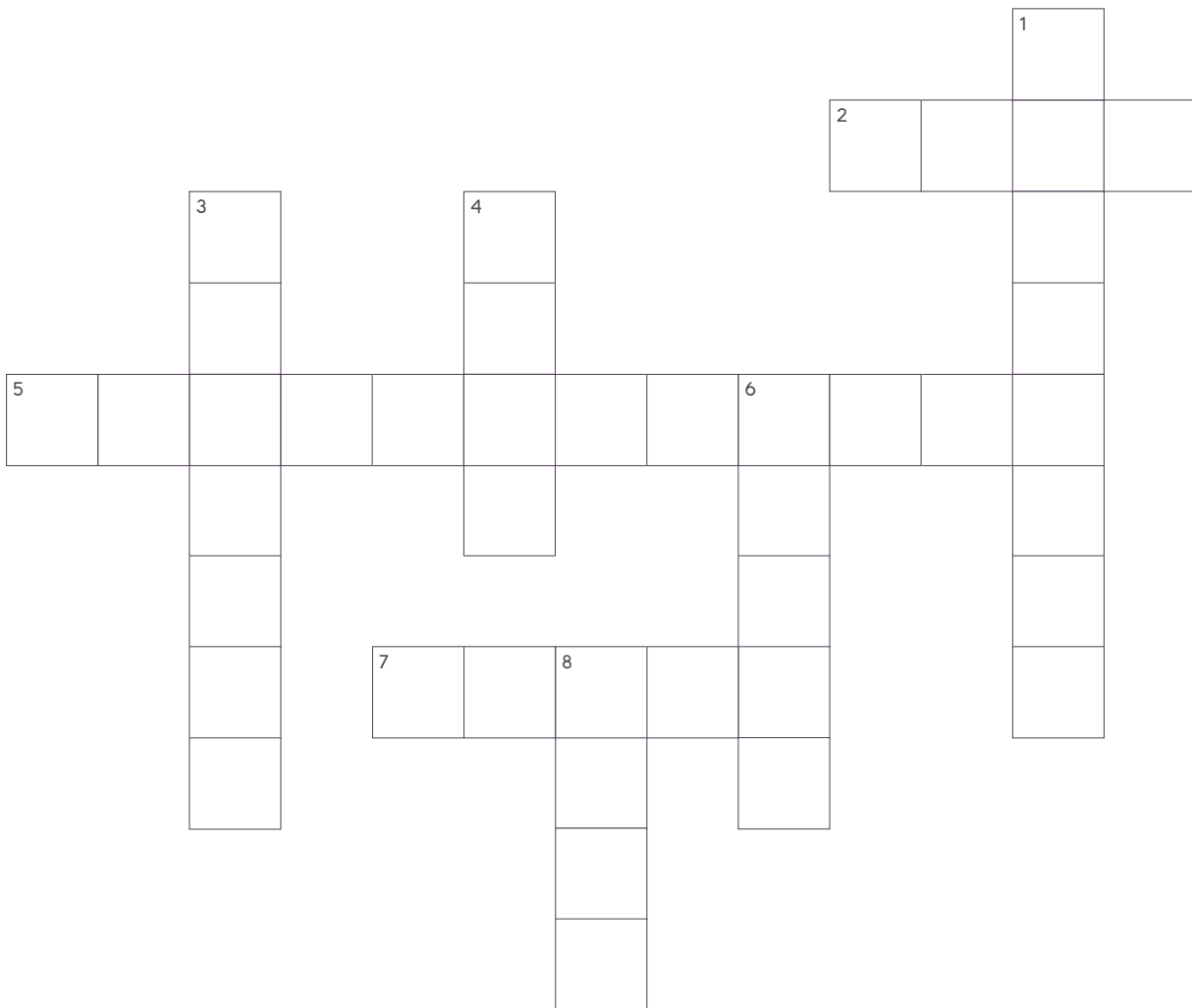

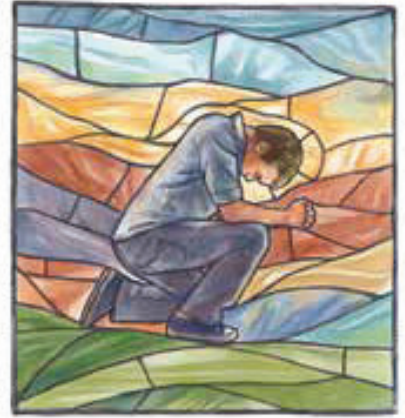

In the years between Jesus’ birth and His death for us on the cross, He grew into a man, called disciples to follow and learn from Him, and began teaching and doing miracles. During this time when Jesus taught and worked miracles, the people who heard and saw Him had different ideas about who He actually was.

Just like the stories we read give hints and foreshadow what will happen next, God was unfolding His “story” and plan of redemption to His people. The story of the gospel is the greatest and truest story of all! For those who had been learning, waiting, and seeking God, Jesus was clearly the Messiah. But since all the details weren’t exactly what they had imagined, some people were too proud to accept Him. How can we keep from responding to God’s truth this way?

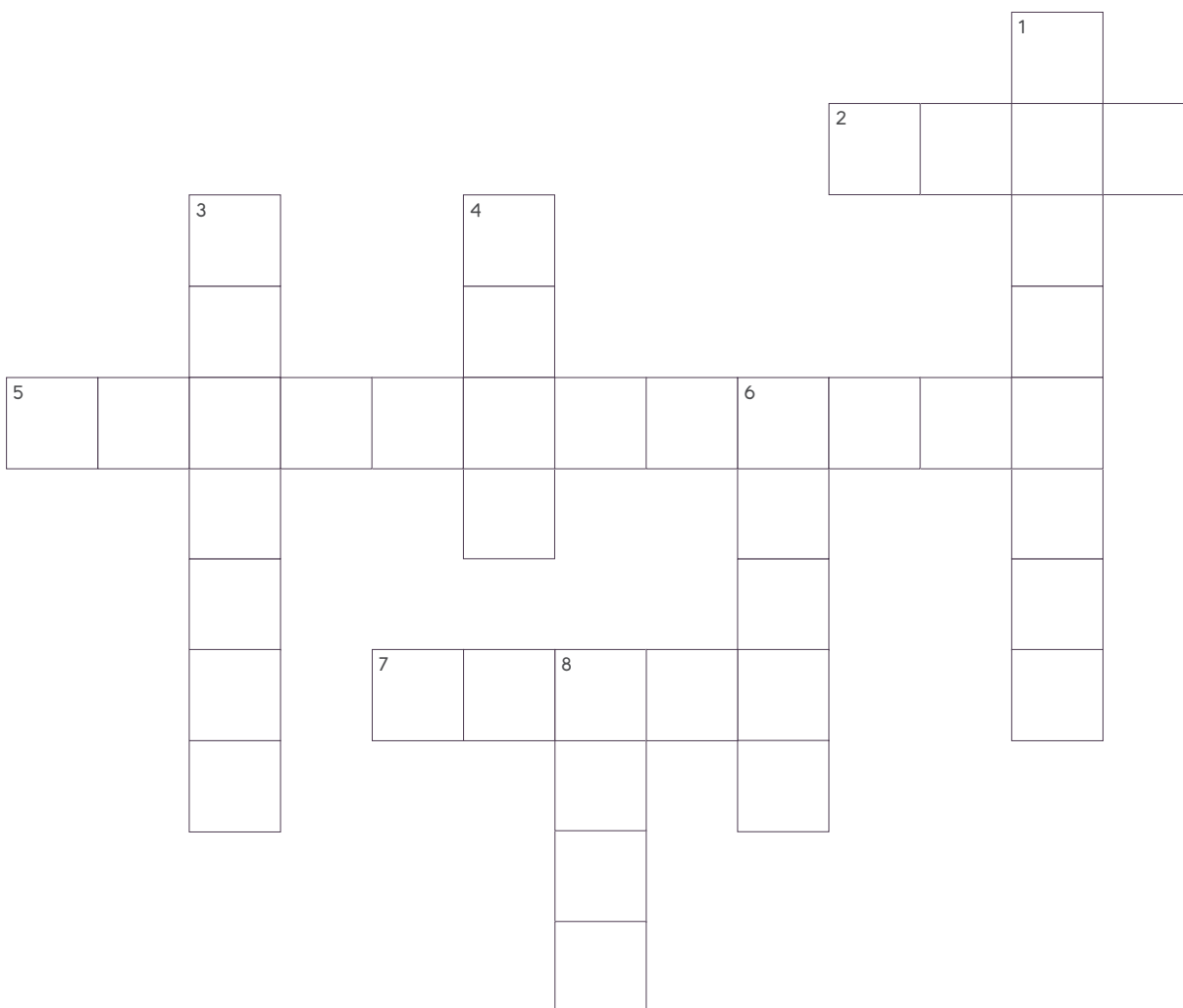
