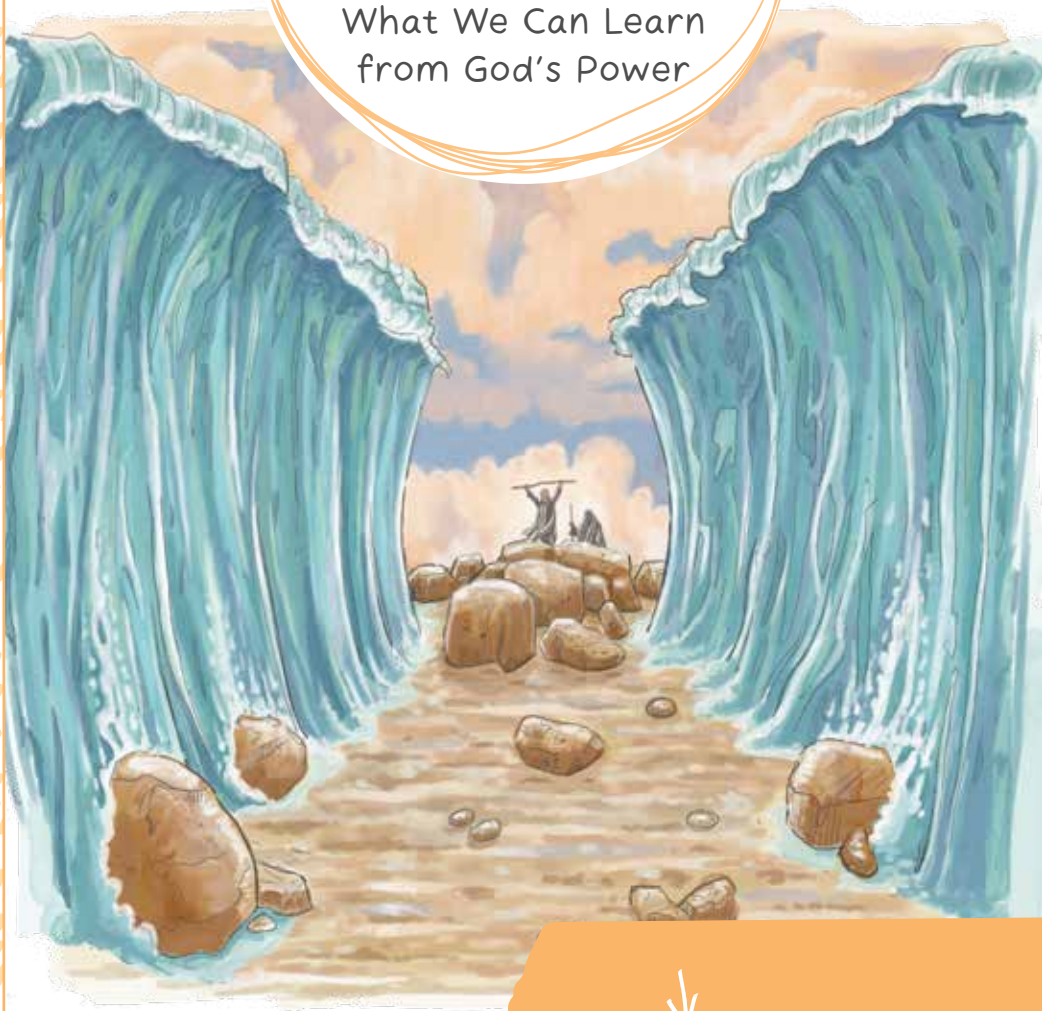

In the Beginning



When you meet someone new, how do you introduce yourself?

In today's lesson, we are going to learn about how God introduced Himself at the beginning of the Bible.

Read ^{KEY VERSE} **Genesis 1:1**. Why do you think God creating the world was a miracle?

With just His words, God created the land, oceans, trees, flowers, birds, giraffes, monkeys, dinosaurs, dogs, cats, humans, and every living thing that exists. No one else could do that! After He made everything, God said that it was good. The miracle of creation shows us that God is good, and God is powerful.

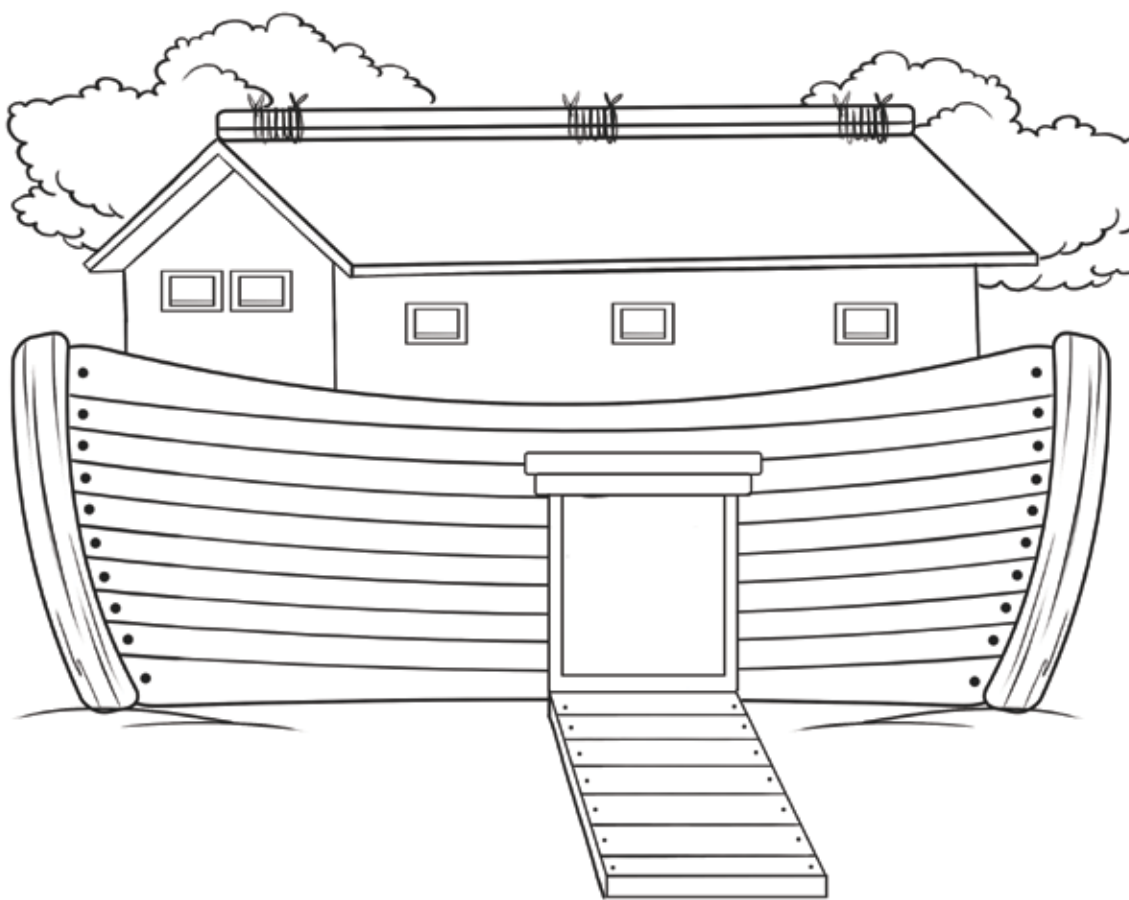
Read **Genesis 7:12**. What happened in this miracle?

Rain fell for 40 days and 40 nights. God had a plan though! He had already told Noah to build the ark. Noah's family and two of every kind of animal were safe on the ark. No one but God could have done all of these things! The miracle of the flood shows the power of God. He is in complete control of all things!

The miracles in Genesis show God's power over and care for the world we live in.

Since God created the whole world, it is easy to believe that God could do all of the miracles in the rest of the Bible! He is the God of miracles. When you feel like things are out of control, you can remember that God is good and powerful. He promises to be with you.

Miracles show us God is good and powerful! Use the stickers to show the miracle of God sending the animals to the ark.

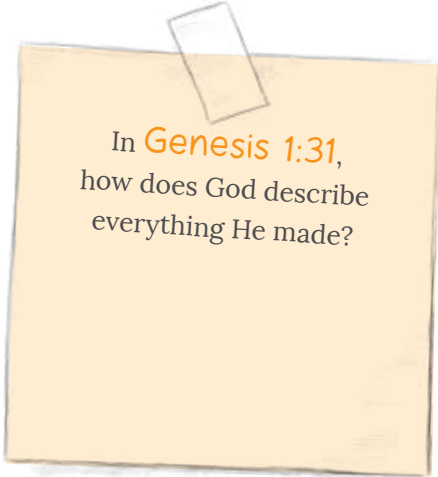
Junior Level
