Read ^{KEY VERSES} **Philippians 2:3–4**. Should we be thinking selfish or proud thoughts? Who should we be thinking about and caring for instead of just ourselves?

It’s not wrong to have fun or be good at something! God gives us good gifts, and we can be thankful for them. It is wrong, though, to have a proud heart that is focused on ourselves and what others think of us. Pride keeps us from loving other people!

I am loving when I am humble.

When you think about others and what they need more than you think about yourself, you are being humble.

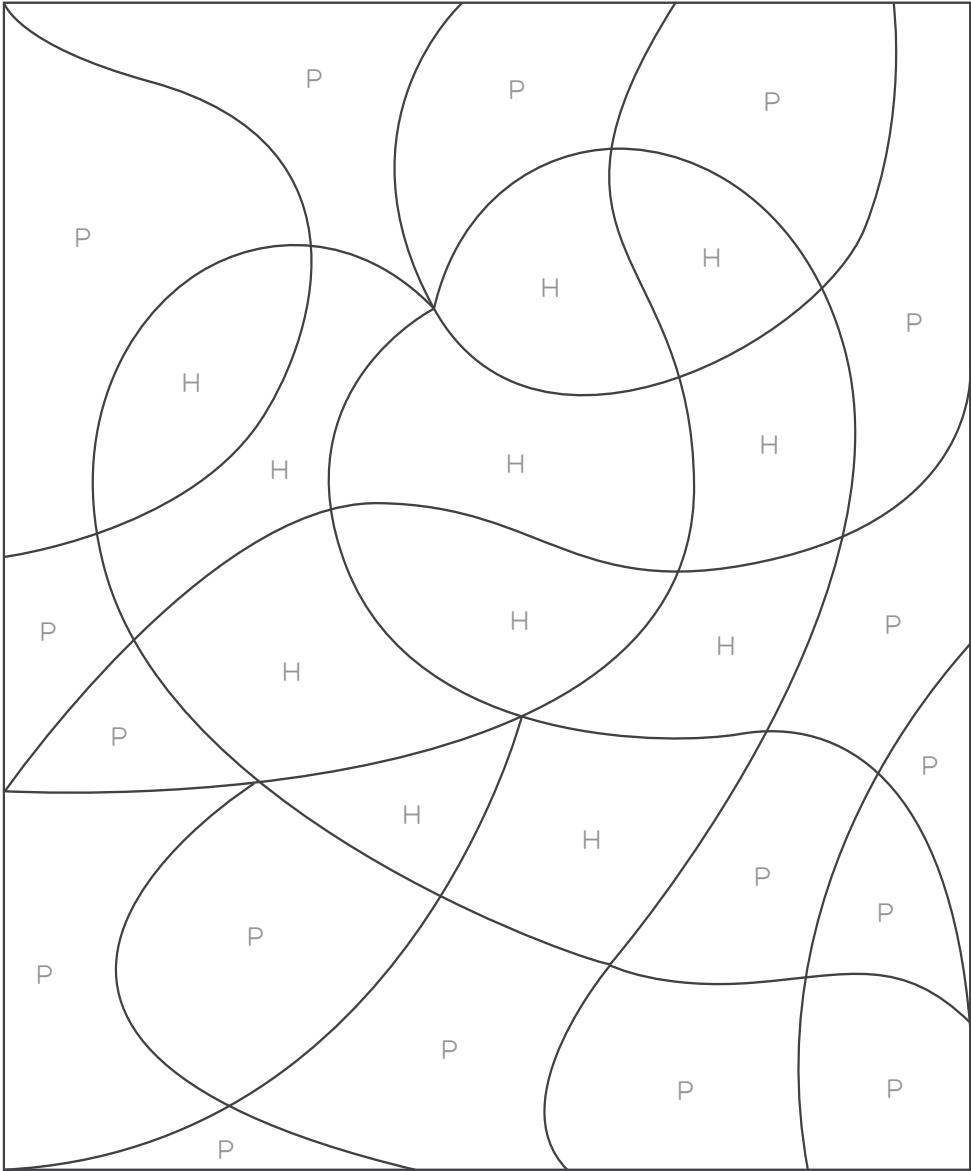
You need to be humble in order to love other people!

Read **Philippians 2:5–8**. What did Jesus do that was humble?

Even though He is God, Jesus is humble. He served us by dying on the cross to pay for our sin. That’s humility—it’s thinking of others the way Jesus thought of us.

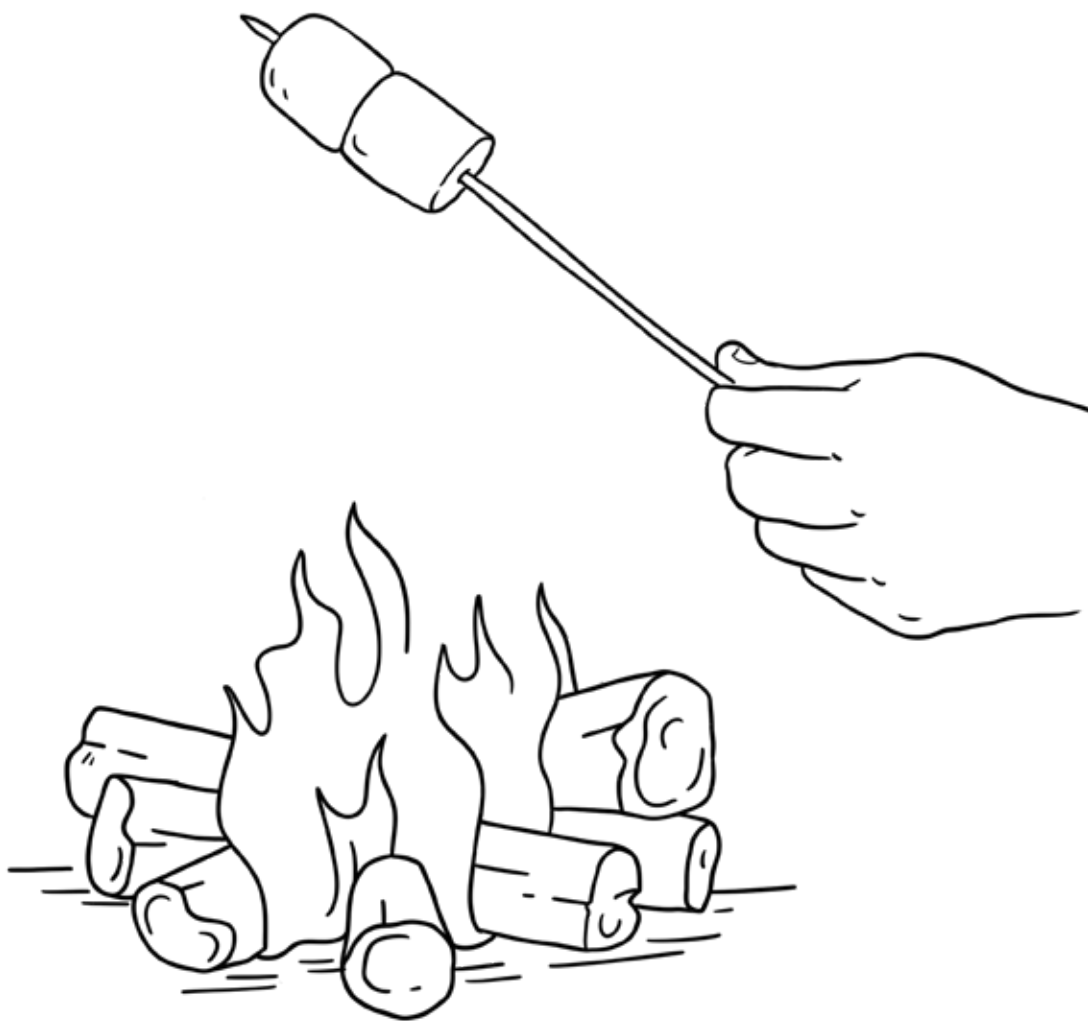
What things do you think count as "good" or "goodness"?

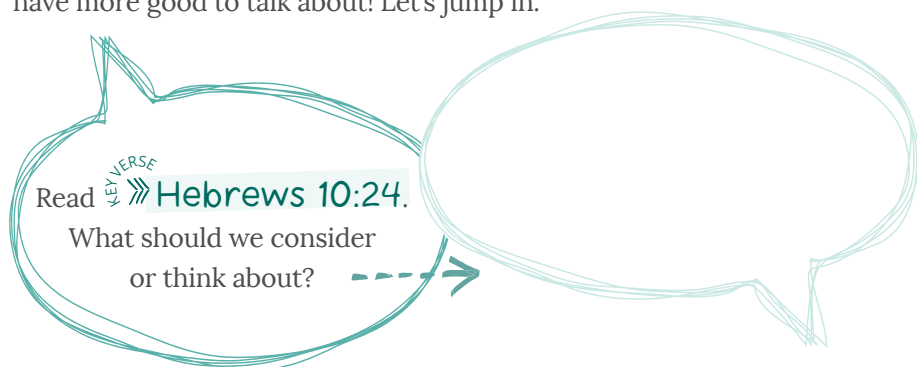

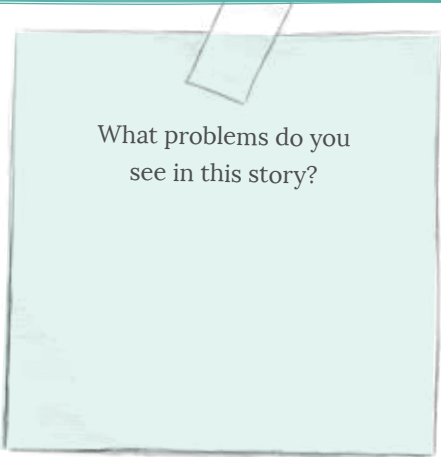

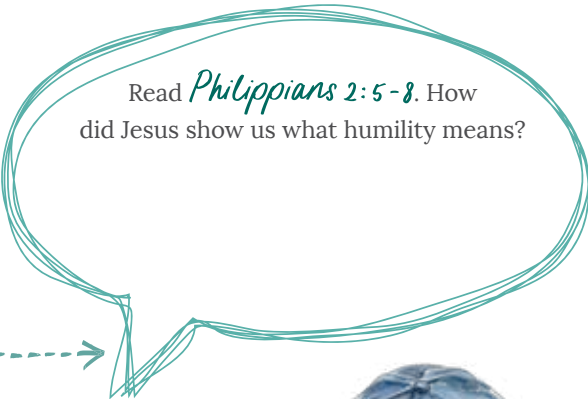

Christians love by being *humble*.

Read *1 Peter 5:5*. What does this verse say about pride and humility?

Woah—did you realize pride sets you against God? It’s true. God will resist those who are full of pride, but He blesses those who humble themselves by recognizing their need for Him. This is the key to a humble heart!

When we are humble before God, He helps us be humble toward one another as well. 1 Peter 5:5 describes this heart attitude as being “clothed with humility” toward one another. What does this humility look like? Well, there’s actually someone who set a perfect example for us. Can you guess who that is?



Even though He is God, Jesus humbled Himself by serving us. His service was the ultimate loving sacrifice we talked about on Day 2 of laying down His own life to pay for our sin.

That’s humility—thinking and caring about others more than yourself. It’s having a correct attitude about your value and worth before God, so you don’t have to be constantly looking for approval and attention from others. This is the same servant mindset that Jesus had!

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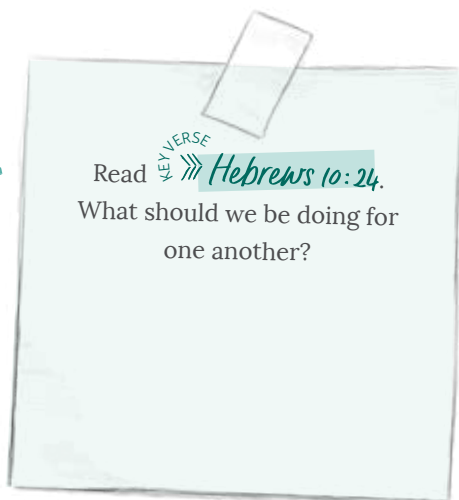

If we're honest, most of us would probably have to admit that we don't think a whole lot about others and their growth in Jesus. We mostly think about ourselves and what we want. It takes a lot of time and concern for someone to truly care about helping them love Jesus and others more.

Read *Romans 12:9*. Along with loving genuinely, what 2 things should Christians do?

The 2 short commands in the second part of this verse tell us the same thing, but in different words. Christians are supposed to abhor, or hate, all evil. When we see or experience evil, we should be grossed out, sad, or repulsed. Nothing in us should be attracted or pulled toward it.

Is this how you feel about evil? What goes through your mind when you see people treating each other in an evil way, or when you see evil in movies or shows?

The positive command in this verse tells us that we should desperately hold onto or cling to good! We should love what is good and do whatever it takes to keep this goodness close. Even if friends make fun of us, we lose privileges, or we're left out of certain groups, God's goodness should be the prize we want most.

What things do you think count as *good* or *goodness*?

Good things always line up with what God says is right and true! Kindness, love, sacrifice, generosity, faithfulness, and so many other virtues described in Scripture fit into this category (Philippians 4:8-9). It is good to be humble instead of proud. Parent Guide

Have you ever (discreetly) laughed a little after watching your kids show off for you or their friends? Their search for approval and praise can be cute and endearing, but it can also be a sign of a struggle beginning in their little hearts.

Maybe you've identified this struggle in your own heart when things don't go according to plan and the result makes you look bad or unprepared. Maybe your heart swells with satisfaction when someone praises your kids for being so smart and talented. Pride is sneaky, and there isn't one person on this earth who doesn't struggle with it in some way.

Read ^{KEY VERSES} *Philippians 2:3-4*. What is God telling us to do in these verses?

It's not wrong to appreciate our kids' gifts and talents or to be happy that our plans went smoothly. God gives us good gifts, and we can be thankful for them. It is wrong, though, to have a proud heart that is focused on ourselves and what others think of us. It's the exact opposite of the heart God says we should have.

If we're proud and only thinking of ourselves, it keeps us from seeing the needs or struggles other people have. When we're too busy noticing ourselves instead of thinking of others, we won't be able to love by helping them or sacrificing for them.

Christians love by being *humble*.

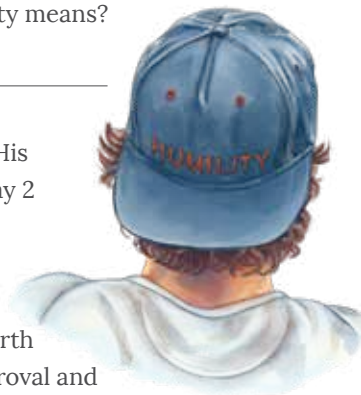

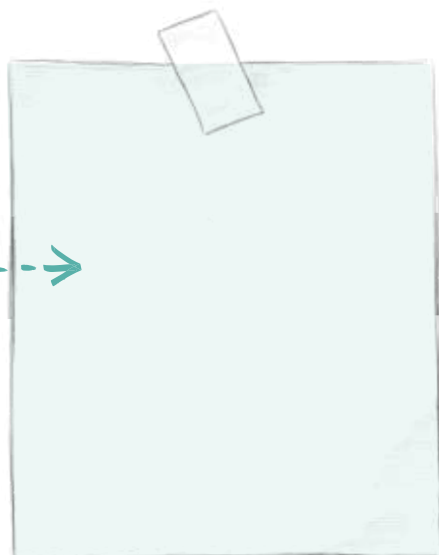

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Get a cup and put a few spoonfuls of dirt inside. Add some water and mix it around; this is what our hearts look like without God and His Word. If someone irritates us, it's like they've bumped our cup, and this gross, muddy mixture will spill out. Now take the cup to the sink and run clean water into it, watching how the dirt gets more and more diluted as you let the water fill the cup to overflowing. This water is like God and His Word: The more we have coming into our hearts, the cleaner the inside of our heart becomes! Now, when somebody "bumps our cup," love from God spills out!

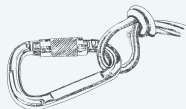
