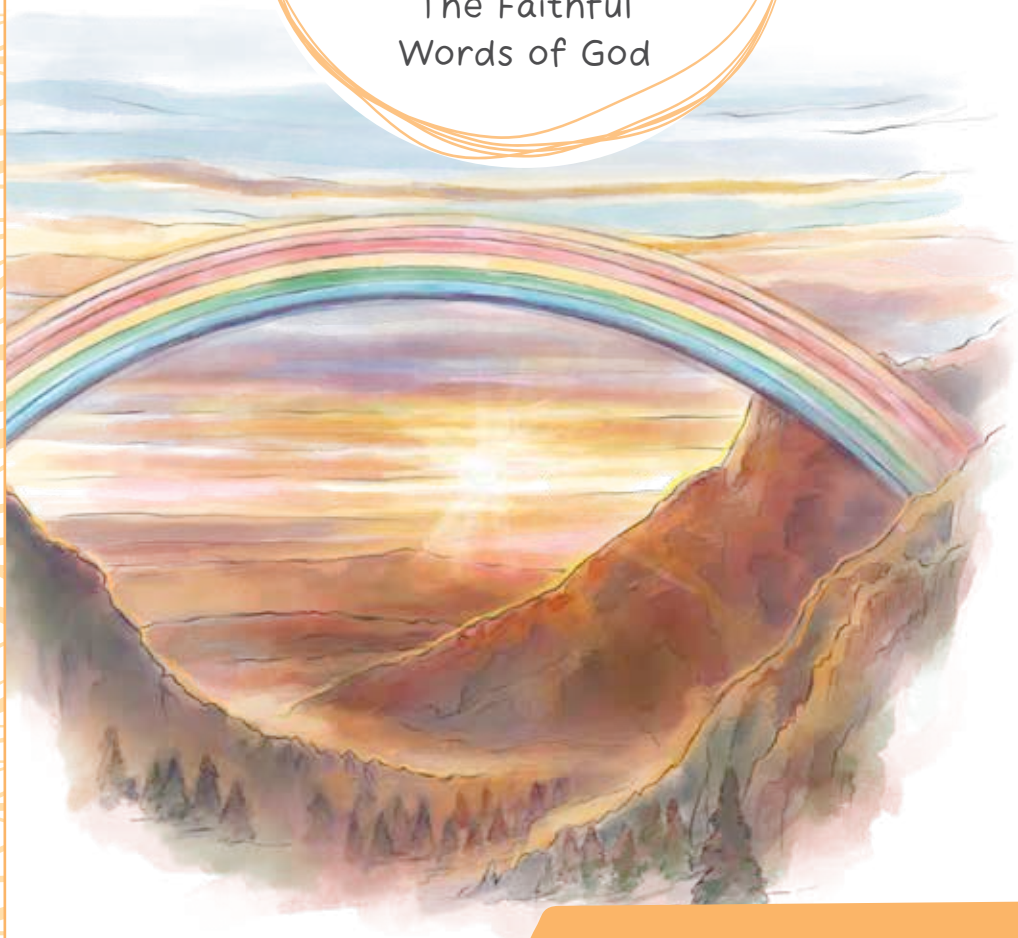

A Land I Will Show You

So far, we have learned about two big covenants God made. Today we get to look at another covenant that shows us more about our God!

Read  **Genesis 12:1-3**. What promises did God make to Abram?

God promised to lead Abraham
to a land that He would give to his descendants
and to bless the whole world through
Abraham's family.

Read **Genesis 12:4**. What did Abram do?

Abram's trust and obedience was all God wanted. God didn't need Abram to help Him out or be a perfect person. God was going to make His promise happen!

Read **Genesis 17:4-7**. What else did God do for Abram?

Abram had a relationship with God, and this was changing everything about him, including his name! God told him his name would now be "Abraham" because he was going to be the father of many nations.

Your life doesn't look quite like Abraham's life, but you also have to trust God like he did! You have to trust God in order to obey your parents and tell the truth. Trusting God will help you be kind to friends who are unkind to you. Most importantly, you have to believe what the Bible says is true.

A Land I Will Show You

Read ^{KEY VERSES} **Genesis 12:1-3**. What promises did God make to Abram?

God wanted Abram to leave his family and go to a land he couldn't see and didn't even know about yet. Then, God would make a great nation of people out of Abram's family. Through this family, God would bring blessing to the whole world! Abram may have had a lot of questions, but the way he responded to God showed his incredible faith in God's plan for him.

Read **Genesis 12:4**. What did Abram do?



Read **Genesis 15:7-12 and 17-18**. What did God do to prove His promise was serious?



All of this can be a little confusing to us because we don't make covenants like this anymore. In this time, the divided animal carcasses were a picture of the seriousness of the covenant.

Usually, both people making the covenant were supposed to walk down the middle of the animals, but we see from the passage that only God—the smoking firepot and flaming torch—passed through them while Abram slept. God was showing him that nothing about this covenant depended on Abram. God had made this promise, and He was going to keep it.

Youth Level

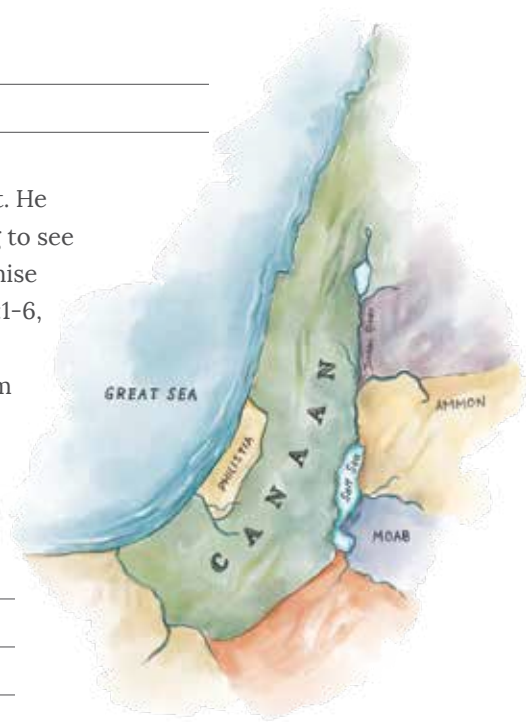

All of this can be a little confusing to us because we don't make covenants like this anymore. In this time, the divided animal carcasses were a picture of the seriousness of the covenant. It was like pointing to the dead animals and saying, "Let me be like these dead animals if I don't keep my promise." Traditionally, both people making the covenant were supposed to walk down the middle of the animals, but we see from the passage that only God—the smoking firepot and flaming torch—passed through them while Abram slept.

The Hebrew word for making a covenant is literally "cut" like the animals Abram cut in half. In a similar way, Jesus was "cut" for us as He died for our sin. This picture reminds us of God's faithfulness to His covenants, including the covenant to send a Savior to make us right with Him.

God was showing him that nothing about this covenant depended on Abram. God had made this promise, and there was nothing Abram could or couldn't do that would thwart God's plan and fulfillment of His covenant.

Read *Genesis 17:1-8*. What else did God do to confirm His promise?

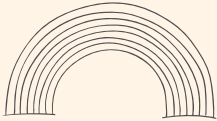
